

Data Summary for 2015-2016

Graduation - Class of 2016

- 312 graduates, 4 seniors did not graduate in June but have graduated after summer school; another senior is an LEP student who will be extending his time in high school.
- 81.7 % of June graduates earned Advanced Regents diplomas (81.6% in 2015)
- 51.9 % earned Advanced Regents diplomas with Honor (49.7% in 2015)
- 33.3 % Special Ed students earned Advanced Regents diplomas (15 of 45)(34.3% in 2015)
- 88.9 % Special Ed students earned at least a Regents diploma
- 97% of all 2016 graduates went on to higher education (99%in 2015)
- 92% of all 2016 graduates went on to 4 year colleges (89.5% in 2015)
- 5.8 % of all 2016 graduates went on to 2 year colleges (7.5% in 2015)
- Average GPA = 88.3 (87.35 in 2015)

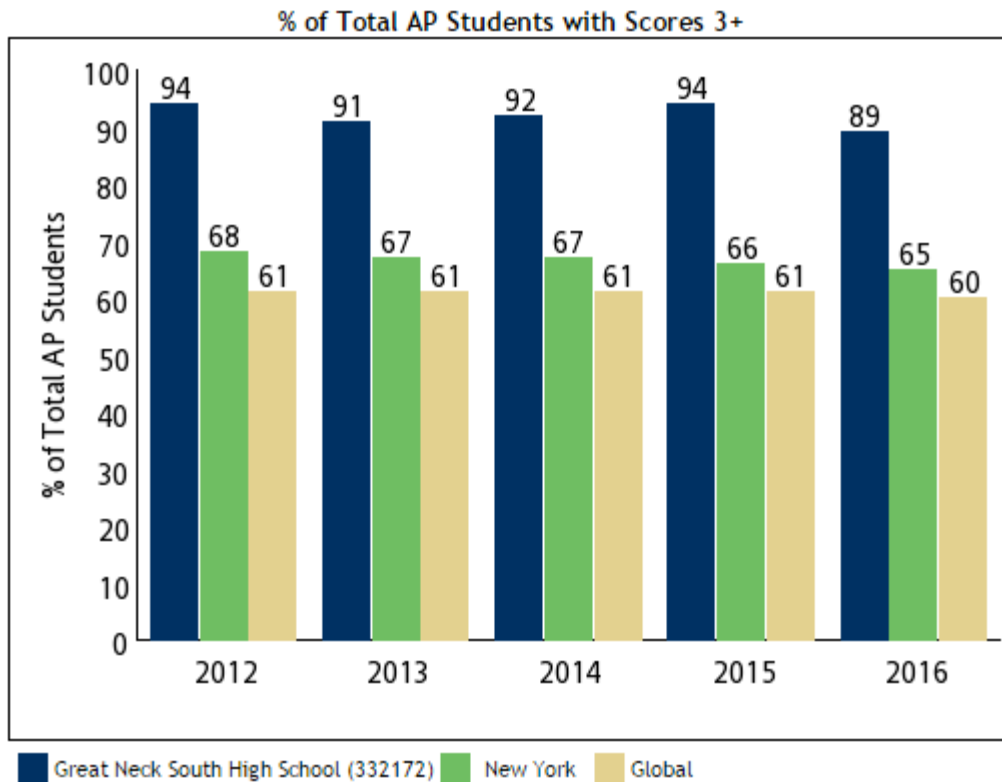
Regents' results

- An average of 96% of our total students passed each regents exam this year.
- Mastery level (85 or above) was achieved by an average of 53% of all regents test takers.
- An average of 94% of our Special Education students passed each regents this year with a minimum grade of 55; 77% passed with 65 or more ; and 22% achieved Mastery level (85 or above).

AP results

- 550 students (of the school) took at least 1 AP exam (42% in 2015, 42% in 2014) for a total of 1375 exams in 2016(1289 exams in 2015)
- 89% earned a 3 or better (92% in 2015 & 2014)
- The mean score on our total exams was 3.88 compared to the New York State mean of 3.0
- 2.9% of test scores were a 1.
- 81% of the class of 2016 took at least one AP exam while in high school

SAT results

- For 2016 graduates the average Critical Reading SAT score was 593, as compared to New York 489, total group 494
- For 2016 graduates the average Math SAT score was 643, as compared to New York 501, total group 508
- For 2016 graduates the average Writing SAT score was 611, as compared to New York 477, total group 482
- Our Verbal score is up 10 points from last year, our Math score is up 13 points from last year, and Writing is up 21 points.

ACT results

- 163 members of the class of 2016 took the ACT exam (147 in 2015)
- 75% met benchmark scores in all 4 ACT areas, indicating a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in a corresponding college level course as compared to New

York State (47%) or the National average (28%). Last year 70% met the benchmark scores.

Demographics

Our total population is currently 1198 (1178 two weeks ago)
(53.5% male, 46.5% female)

- Approximately 128 students (11%) will be classified as Special Ed, with an additional 16 students having 504's.
- Approximately 182 students (15%) will be qualified for free or reduced lunch.
- Approximately 103 (8.7%) students will be receiving TESL services
- Approximately 182 students (15%) receive free or reduced lunch
- Grade 9: 290 (2015: 271) Grade 10: 287 (2015: 302)
Grade 11: 307(2015: 299) Grade 12: 314 (2015: 328)
